<u>Legalization of Recreational Use of</u> <u>Marijuana is the Topic Program</u>

Arizona voters will likely be voting in the November General Election on whether or not to legalize recreational marijuana. There could actually be two competing ballot measures seeking legalization of marijuana. The Arizona Regulation and Taxation of Marijuana Act and the Legalization and Regulation of Marijuana Act are being offered as initiatives by separate organizations currently collecting signatures required to make the ballot.

Special Election, May 17th

On May 17th Arizona voters will be asked to approve Proposition 123 (Education Funding), which would increase the distributions from the State Land Trust Permanent Endowment Fund from 2.5% to 6.9% to benefit Arizona K-12 schools, colleges, and other beneficiary institutions.

Also on the ballot is Proposition 124, which changes Arizona public retirement systems to adjust benefits in the Public Safety personnel system to alleviate underfunding, including a cost of living adjustment indexed for inflation and capped at 2% per year.

Women's Right to Vote Celebration Both propositions are Amendments to the Arizona Constitution. The League of Women Voters of Arizona opposes Proposition 123 and urges voters to vote "NO" on Prop.123. The League does not have a position on Prop. 124 and it has few opponents.

On April 27th, the League sponsored a public forum on Proposition 123, Our speaker was Matthew Goodwin, a senior lecturer at NAU's Department of Philosophy, who has studied the language of this legislation in detail. He explained how the bill came about and described many questionable provisions that voters might not realize are there. He sparked a lively conversation among many knowledgeable participants who attended the forum. Whatever the outcome of the May 17th vote, follow-on action will be needed to assure that funding for education in Arizona is adequate in the long term.

116 Days of the Arizona Legislature!

The Legislature passed over 100 new bills in this 116 day session. Here is a recap of bills the LWV Arizona tracked and commented on during this past session.

- HCR2023 Prop 105, legislative authority. Lets
 Legislature amend any initiative or referendum
 passed by the voters. It passed in Rules
 Committee and went nowhere. No Action
- HCR2043 Initiative & Referendum, voting percentage. Modifies Legislature power to amend, divert funds or supersedes a voter approved ballot initiative and referendum measure. It passed in Rules Committee and went nowhere. No Action
- SB1516 Campaign finance amendments. It passed the House and Senate and signed by the Governor, BUMMER!
- SB1279 Empowerment Scholarship Accounts
 Expansion. Vouchers for any kid going to a public school and is on the free or reduced lunch program. It was heard in House COW (committee of the whole) on 3-30 and was held there No

- SB1280 Empowerment Scholarship Accounts, eligibility, administration. Various changes in scholarship empowerment accounts. It had its' 3rd and final reading in the House and was sent to governor and he signed it.
- SB1457 Empowerment Scholarship Accounts, persons with disabilities, became a strike all bill to pay monies to kids until age 22. It was amended to add KidsCare in House COW (committee of the whole) then sent to the Senate for final reading, and finally sent to the Governor who signed it.
 HOORAY For KidsCare!

HOURAY FOR KidsCare!

- HB2537 Supreme court justices, increase the number. It passed the House and Senate and signed by the Governor. BUMMER!
- HCR2009 IRC, elected membership. Commission members would be elected, not appointed. It passed the Senate Rules on 4-4 but just sat there. No Action.
- HCR2035 Clean Elections, lobbying, rulemaking.
 Bars Clean Elections Commission from lobbying.
 It was heard in Senate COW (committee of the whole) and passed as AMENDED which was to send extra money to the School classrooms. It had its' 3rd Reading and was sent to House for concurrence. The House DID NOTHING. No Action.


